How Feedback Informs the Master Plan Review and Renewal

Feedback provided through each public participation and engagement activity was reviewed and considered in the context of whether it can be addressed using the Master Plan process and is it supported by the existing policy framework. Feedback from each activity was then synthesized by the project team into key themes and messages for the entire stage to help evaluate and identify ideas we heard across diverse groups.



Key Messages from Stage 1

Heritage and Culture

- Update the definition of heritage and how culture, history and heritage are considered in the master plan.
- Create spaces to support Indigenous ceremony, acknowledge Indigenous presence, and honour treaty rights.

Tensions Between Uses/Users

- Manage the number of users and diverse uses of Wascana Centre while minimizing risk to people and sensitive ecological places.
- Consider hierarchy or priority within the Purposes (Pillars).
- Identify ways to avoid overprogramming and over-developing wellused areas within the Centre.

Redefining Landscape Character

- Consider changes to what defines the park landscape and experience.
- Expand low-impact and sustainable management practices throughout the Centre.
- Identify opportunities to limit the use of pesticides and chemicals and support more regionally-adapted and native plantings.
- Prioritize the ecological quality and function of the landscapes within the Centre.

Strengthen Language

- Clarify definitions of the uses allowed in Wascana Centre.
- Consider ways to protect against uses that do not support the Five Purposes, especially commercial development.
- Consider suitability of smaller scale commercial uses to provide amenity to park users.

Addressing Representation

- Ensure all potential users and communities can contribute to the master plan process.
- Engage communities and provide opportunities for communities to have an active role in initiatives that directly impact them beyond the master plan update.

Decision Making

- Improve communication and awareness about the master plan and decision making process.
- Facilitate public awareness about management, programming, and funding for spaces and facilities within Wascana Centre.

Evolution of Wascana Over 110 Years

The concept of Wascana as a place of significance predates the establishment of the provincial capital. However, the first recorded plan for this area was prepared over 100 years ago to coincide with the development of the Legislative Grounds. That plan set out an organizing framework of spaces that would inform the development of this plan, and laid the groundwork for an approach to stewardship and land management that is unlike any other.

The plan is not static.

Both the form and content of the plan have changed significantly over the 110 year history of planning for Wascana Centre. Uses, spaces, and structures have been added, removed, expanded and reduced. In 1982, a report with supporting planning directions was introduced to explain the rationale behind different shifts in the layout of Wascana Centre. These directions (or principles) shed light on public and institutional priorities for each update.


Factors Impacting the 2023 Review

A Vision For The Next 100 Years

Wascana Centre is a place to gather, share, and celebrate the history and diversity of Saskatchewan. It embodies the stewardship of public land for the benefit and enjoyment of current and future generations through conservation, recreation, education, and culture.

Principles

Within the master plan, principles provide over-arching guidance and intent for how to implement various initiatives.

Some principles are broad and apply to conditions throughout Wascana Centre (such as Universal Access), while others only relate to specific elements within the plan (such as Pedestrian Trails).

Many of the principles noted below were included in the 2016 Master Plan Update. For 2023, we have reorganized the principles into groups to make them easier to understand. We have also provided a statement summarizing the intent of the principle to help direct application of the principles.
